

Pastoral Department

1. Introduction

The Pastoral Department coordinates the Eparchy's Pastoral activities. Five years strategic plan was prepared & the operational plan for 2012-2013 has been accomplished. According to our operational plan of this year, the pastoral department accomplished the listed activities in the above contents and which its description will be following up.

The department has also implemented the formative activities for the Catechists with all its scarcities. And as a result of this, it displays significant achievements and identifies constraints that limit the full operation of the pastoral activities.

2. Plan of action

The **primary purposes** of the Pastoral Department are always:

- To foster development of mature and committed catechists.
- To strengthen the Christian leadership capacity of Religious congregation sisters, Parish council, Youth leaders and CESK members.
- To strengthen family Catechism in parishes.
- To foster development of mature youth and enhance their participation in Church's life (Eparchial Youth Association and its specific program)
- To improve communication among Pastoral office, Parish Priests, parish council and Catechists.
- To form and strengthen parish councils, Presbyterial council, Eparchial council and to clarify & improve their role in the whole Eparchy.

3. Pastoral statistics in the Catholic Eparchy of Keren

The Eparchy of Keren has **41 Parishes** and **52 Chapels**. The Parishes are guided by 39 Diocesan, Capuchin and Lazarist Parish Priests. The number of active Catechists in the Diocese of Keren is 57 distributed as it follows:

We have enough Catechists in the Protopresbyterate of Keren. However, the Protopresbyterates of Habimentel and Hagaz have villages and Chapels without catechists.

4. Experience sharing among various religious congregation sisters

On the 17th of December 2012, the members of different Religious congregation sisters have visited Filfil. It was a one day program aiming at; staying together, praying, making recreation and enriching each other in all aspects. It was interesting for them in all dimensions of their Socio-pastoral services. Unity and sharing experiences was also part of this objective. Based on the “Year of Faith”, they planned the other two workshops which they should follow within the year of 2013. According to the plan, the first workshop was organized on 05 January 2013 and the second was on 09 March 2013. According to their feedback and evaluations conducted at the end of the day; the program was very good, constructive and fruitful.

5. Catechetical Training Program

Introductory Trainings for 7 new Catechists

The pastoral office hired, trained and assigned 7 new catechists to their respective villages from October-November of 2012. They have attended their introductory training on the 19th of November 2012.

The training was on:-

- Orientation and self-exploratory questions
- The way how to prepare lesson plan
- Methodology of Prayer.
- Methodology to Catechism

The objectives were; to upgrade their knowledge and assign them as Catechists in replacement of the aged ones and those who left job, to foster in them awareness and give them the responsibility of Catechism, to make them familiar to their mission, to produce competent Catechists at all levels of the society, and to form them as the agents of evangelization. As a feedback they expressed their gratitude of what they have received.

1st year’s Catechetical Training for the 4th Group of Catechists

This training focused on 4th group of Catechists on their 1st year program. 16 participants have attended their first term annual training from 26-28 of February 20113. The training was facilitated by Abba Tesfasselassie (Abadu), Abba Merhawi Habtay and Abba Dawit Tecele.

The Training covered:

- The Apostolic Creed
- Social Teaching of the Church
- Counseling
- Human sexuality and moral ethics.



The second session was from 27-29 August 2013, facilitated by; Abba Habteul Ghebray, Abba Merhawi Habtay, Abba Quazien Hamde, and Abba Dawit Tecle in the Eparchial hall consecutively. The subjects covered were;

1. Church History

- a. Church Apostolic community in Jerusalem
- b. The church's expansion, confrontation with Judaism and Hellenism
- c. The Roman persecution and Constantine turning point (1st-3rd century).

2. Sacraments

- a. Introduction to the Sacraments

Christmas Retreat for all Catechists

Workshops for all Religious Sisters in the Eparchy

Two workshops were given to various religious sisters who are working in the Eparchy. As it was in the “Year of Faith”, both workshops were about faith. The first was 2nd Part of CCC (about Liturgy) and was on 5 January 2013. It was facilitated by Abba Yonas Yohannes. The second was given on 9 February 2013 by Abba Zerachaymanot Sium. It was about “Faith and Eternal Life”. Both workshops were held at the Eparchial hall. Each workshop was held for one day. The Sisters attended the lectures with interest and participated actively by asking questions. Subjects covered, were helpful for the ministry within which they give service and to their personal spirituality & faith.



8. Graduation of 3rd group of Catechists 08/12/2012

The 3rd group of Catechists who have been following their Regular Catechetical formation from 2010-2013 have graduated on the 8th of December 2012. The occasion began with the celebration of the Mass which led by most reverend Abune Kidane Yebio at the Eparchial chapel. After the reading of the Gospel, the Bishop gave a beautiful homily and at the end of the mass he awarded/certified the catechists with certificates and the Holy Bible which is the spiritual weapon as a sign of apostolate. After the Mass communal breakfast was taken place. Then, some of the catechists have said some words of thanks and expressed their happiness and expressed their good will to give service to brothers, the Church and God. The bishop concluded the program with thanksgiving, reminding of their responsibility, prayers and gave them the final pastoral blessings.

These catechists are those who attended the three regular years of catechetical formation. Even though they started in a good number, only 14 catechists are completed their formation (courses). This certifying is held for the third time. And now the 4th group is taking their courses to be certified after 3 years.

9. Annual Feast of the Catechists

This year also the Catechists celebrated their third year annual feast on 8 June 2013 in a very attractive manner and well organized program. They celebrated it under the umbrella of **Abba Fesseha Gebreamlak “The servant of God”** who they have chosen as their patron. The feast began by Holy Mass, celebrated by Reverend Bishop Kidane Yebio and Abba Hailemariam Ghebre at the Eparchial chapel. And it continued with a very short and attractive program till 12:00 pm one of which was a lecture emphasized on the life history of Abba Fesseha Gebreamlak, the spirituality, devotion and prayers which should be done in his name particularly and in the name of all the saints in general. The lecture was given by the Cistercian monk Abba Hailemariam Ghebre. Most Reverend Bishop Kidane, Eparch of the Eparchy of Keren, opened the program with a prayer and a short speech. Then Abba Uqbagaber W/ghiorgis, the secretary general, welcomed the guests and participants and briefly explained the goal and objectives of the feast. Finally, Most Reverend Bishop Kidane Yebio advised the Catechists, and participants and gave his blessings. The program concluded with a shared lunch.

- Low bonuses
- Limited budget
- Lack of dedication on the side of Catechists
- Sense of dependency from parishes side
- Delay to withdraw the monthly bonus of the Catechists
- Limited youth organization and empowerment.
